Happy New Year! The start of a new year and a new decade! We wish all of our RHPS families the very best as we enter 2010!

The students are becoming excited about International Cultures Night, which will be held on Saturday, January 30 from 5–7 p.m. We are looking forward to sharing our family displays and culinary delights at the buffet table! We will also celebrate the coin collecting campaign for Heifer International. Students have been bringing in coins and recording their donations. I hope you get a chance to see the bulletin board by the office that tracks the campaign’s progress. This wonderful display has helped to increase the excitement for the campaign. On January 26, cultural consultants from Costa Rica and Togo will conduct assemblies to further pique student interest.

To honor the contributions of Black citizens throughout history during African American History Month, we will highlight individuals and their accomplishments during our morning announcements.

Soon an informational letter about our upcoming Kindergarten Orientation will be sent home. If you do not receive a letter or need an additional letter, you can pick one up in the main office. Incoming students must be five years old on or before September 1, 2010, in order to enroll in kindergarten. If you have a prospective kindergarten, or know of a neighbor with one, please complete the bottom portion of the letter and return it to the school as soon as possible. We will have Kindergarten Orientation on Wednesday, May 5, and Thursday, May 6, 2010. Once we know who wishes to attend this event, we will contact families with their designated appointment times. **Please remember that kindergarten classes will be canceled on these two days (May 5 and 6).**

During the week of April 26, all second graders will take a standardized assessment called the TerraNova-Second Edition (TN/2). The TN/2 measures student performance in reading, language, language mechanics, mathematics, and mathematics computation through multiple choice questions. This assessment serves as a measure of individual student performance, as well as an important indicator of academic school success. **As such, it is imperative that all students are present for each day of testing.** Please avoid scheduling doctor appointments for the week of April 26 so that students can participate in this important test.

La Orientación para Kindergarten se llevará a cabo el miércoles 5 y jueves 6 de mayo de 2010. Una vez sepamos quienes desean participar en este evento, contactaremos las familias y les informaremos la hora de su cita. **Favor recordar que no habrá clase de Kindergarten durante estos dos días (5 y 6 de mayo).**

Durante la semana del 26 de abril, los estudiantes de segundo grado tomarán una prueba estándar llamada TerraNova-Second Edition (TN/2). El TN/2 mide el rendimiento del estudiante en lectura, lenguaje, mecánica del lenguaje, matemáticas y matemática computacional a través de preguntas de selección múltiple. Esta prueba sirve para medir el rendimiento del estudiante, y también como indicador importante del éxito académico de la escuela. **Por lo tanto, es indispensable que los estudiantes estén presentes los días de las pruebas.** Les agradezco por adelantado programar las citas médicas antes o después de esta semana para que los estudiantes puedan participar en esta prueba tan significativa.

Volunteers! Please Use the New Volunteer Log-In Book

When you come in to volunteer, please remember to mark your time in the new Volunteer Log-In Book. By quantifying our volunteer support, we will achieve two goals: appropriate recognition for outstanding commitment, and hard data to use with the Board of Education in supporting the needs of the school.

Typical volunteer activities include: Lunch/recess duty, classroom volunteering, laminating, and PTA events like Super Saturday, Silent Auction, Staff Appreciation, Book Fair, field trips, etc.

Here are some helpful hints to remember:

- If you have volunteered already, find your page by last name. If there is no page for you, please fill out a new one (see sample form in the log-in book)
 - Everyone should include at least one point of contact (address, phone or email).
 - Record your time in, time out and total time at the school. Also include any time spent at home or away from school in a volunteer capacity. Please list the activity or classroom under 'supervising teacher/staff member.'
 - If you have done volunteering away from the school (field trip, meetings, data entry, event planning), please include that activity on your log sheet as well.
 - At the end of each month, add up your hours and put them in the 'hours to date' column.
 - The PTA Volunteer Coordinator will compile monthly totals throughout the year.

Fitness Stars Program Returns to RHPS!

Do you ever wonder if your child is getting enough exercise? Are you looking for support in encouraging your child to lead a healthy lifestyle? The RHPS PTA, in conjunction with the RHPS teachers and staff, is excited to announce the launch of a new health and wellness program called Fitness Stars. In the heart-healthy spirit of Valentine's Day, the program will begin the week of February 8 and is designed to encourage your children to exercise regularly and to engage in physical activities that are fun for them.

Activities as simple as walking to and from the bus stop or school, participating in gym class, and playing during outdoor recess will count towards your child's daily goal. Additional activities outside of school can include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Playing outside
- Walking/hiking/jogging
- Bike riding
- Baseball/Softball
- Basketball
- Bowling

- Dancing
- Football
- Raking/Shoveling snow
- Gymnastics
- Karate or Tae Kwon Do
- Housekeeping
- Jumping rope
- Skating (ice or rollerblading)
- Swimming
- Tennis
- Soccer



Students who wish to participate will work with their parents to track their physical activity on a Fitness Stars Activity Log. Each week, the activity will be entered into a database at school. Students will receive a prize for logging 5 hours and after logging each additional 5 hours (i.e., 5, 10, 15). The PTA will also maintain a bulletin board that will track the number of hours logged by each class. Watch for more information in backpack mail, on the RHPS listserv and on the RHPS PTA web site.

Health Room Update

We hope that you are finding the new health form useful and informative (this form is sent home if your child visits the health room, explaining the reason for the visit and action taken). **Please keep us informed of any medical situation that occurs during the weekend or in the evening.** The health room staff must be informed of any/all health concerns. It is very helpful for us to know the circumstances of an injury when a student appears at school with a cast or on crutches.

Also, we learned about some students who had head lice recently. Parents followed all the correct steps in treating the outbreak*, but did not alert the health room. To minimize further infestations, upon the student's return to school, **the student must be checked in the health room in order to be cleared to return to the classroom.**

*All lice and/or nits within ½ inch of the scalp must be removed before your child may return to the classroom.
